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Description

Maiden Meadow offers a fantastic opportunity for woodland creation alongside existing Ancient Semi-Natural Woodland and would be of interest to anyone looking to own a substantial parcel of land in private and secluded spot.

The land is characterised by its scenic location and variation of habitats. The majority of the land is an extensive meadow bordered on two sides by thick hedgerows, with an enchanting fringe of woodland occupying the eastern section. A gently flowing stream flanks the land to the south, running the length of the meadow and the woodland, where it forms the boundary both to the south and the east. Access to a natural water source is a fantastic resource and excellent for wildlife.

The land is at its highest point to the west where spectacular views of the River Severn estuary can be enjoyed. From here, it very gradually drops away to the east towards the woodland. The wooded area is a rich and dynamic habitat containing stunning mature oak trees with a vibrant understory. At this time of the year, bluebells and wood anemone adorn the woodland floor. As one heads down the meadow, the woodland presents as a wall of green in the summer, offering shady spots at the meadows edge. A small opening invites you in, from where a woodland path snakes away in front of you, drawing you into a magical setting. Dappled sunlight and well spaced mature trees form the perfect woodland scene. The area is awash with a variety of wildlife, with hares, deer, badgers and a plethora of birds all a regular site.

In addition to being a lovely amenity space, and source of firewood, the woodland will act as a powerful seed source for the natural regeneration of the open land. With seeds blowing in, or carried by animals, the open land will begin to be colonised by various species, extending the boundaries of the woodland ecosystem. The establishment of woodland can be accelerated through active tree planting, for which a number of grants are readily available. The Forestry Commission designate the meadow as a woodland priority habitat, as they are keen to see existing woodland extended. This is an ideal location for woodland creation, either for private amenity purposes or carbon offsetting. It would make a great spot for a family woodland, leaving a lasting legacy for future generations to enjoy.

Maiden Meadow is located just outside the small village of Blakeney in The Forest of Dean and is within easy reach of Gloucester, Bristol, Monmouth and the surrounding Wye Valley. Access is via a well stoned track directly from the A48 providing year round vehicular access to the land.

Local area and history

Maiden Meadow falls within the former grounds of Hawfield House, a grand 16th century estate with views across the River Severn and the Cotswold escarpment beyond. It is found just outside the village of Blakeney, the largest village in the parish of Awre and the site of a Roman villa dating back to AD 75, uncovered in 1992 by the Dean Archaeology Group.

After crossing the concrete ford, turn right at the next opportunity, where Maiden Meadow is down on your right hand side




Satnav: the postcode GL15 4AD is the nearest to the main entrance where you can park.


Bing maps location
