Description

In 2023 the **Shropshire Council Community Trees Scheme** offered grants to people who wished to plant trees and short sections of hedging, and to create small areas of woodland in Shropshire. They may offer the same again in 2024. Grants are available through the the UK government for planting trees as well as stewardship grants. https://www.gov.uk/countryside-stewardship-grants for various criteria relating to the countryside and environment.

Trees

A glorious open field with superb sunshine ready to plant or leave as is. Amazing views of the woodlands and valley around with superb access to unspoiled countryside.

Wildlife

Open hedged rather than fenced fields allow wildlife free rein throughout this area. Muntjac, badger, moles, voles, rabbits and much more call this area home.

Open sloping field with outstanding views of the valley and woodlands around.

Local area and history

<u>Stiperstones</u>. See the Ordovician 'Stiperstones Quartzite', which is a wild and distinctive landscape rich with geology of national significance.

The whole area is steeped in history and accessible through various walks including The Shropshire Way

<u>Bishop's Castle</u> (11 miles, 20 minutes away) is an unspoiled working town dating from the Medieval period. Built on a very steep hill, it is surrounded by a spectacular Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty on the border with Wales, midway between <u>Ludlow</u> and <u>Shrewsbury</u>.

Mining has always been an important part of the <u>history of Shropshire</u> and that history includes remains of mines at <u>Ritton castle</u> and its environs.

How to find this meadow

You are welcome to visit this meadow by yourself, but please ensure that you have a copy of these sales details with you - many of our meadows do not have mobile phone reception or internet access so we recommend either printing the details or downloading them to your phone/tablet/laptop.

Do remember to also check that it is still available for sale. If you have seen the meadow and wish to be accompanied on a second more detailed visit please contact our local manager.

Directions

Nearest postcode takes you to The Bog farm, but stay on the road towards The Bog Visitor Centre. When coming from the north, Stiperstones/Shelve, keep going along to the end of the straight road (a quarter of a mile past Bog Farm) and the centre is on the

side of the road to your right.

Follow the track (a little rough, but alright for an ordinary car) down the side of the visitors centre for approx 300 metres, past a turn to the left, and continue to follow the small WOODLANDS FOR SALE arrow signs for another 200m or so. Here you will find a gate on the left hand side with a WOODLANDS ACCESS sign.

Please call in advance for the gate access code. If you do not have the code, park to the right of the gate, without blocking access, and continue on foot.

Through this gate, follow the signs for 100m till you get to a right turn, turn right and then after approximately 100m there will be a locked gate with a parking bay.


Walk along the track for approximately 50 metres and the parking bay and entrance to BLUNDSTONE PADDOCK is on the left hand side of the track.



Boundaries:

Fenced on two sides with open access to the front onto the track through the main Ritton Castle site access route. Its southwestern boundary is an earthbank with mature trees. Marked with boundary posts with ORANGE heads.
